

Reach Trucks

Reach trucks are loading devices used by varieties of businesses that sustain a storage facility or supply center relating to the arrangement of completed merchandise and supplies on pallets which are inserted into elevated shelving units. This machine provides straightforward and dependable retrieval of the loaded pallets while ensuring efficient storage of goods that are not needed immediately.

The basic reach truck utilizes an out rigging mechanism installed on the front of the vehicle. A set of telescoping forks that move up and down are mounted to the out rigging. A hydraulic setup which allows the worker to pick up and reposition the cargo over the outriggers is also included in the forks. This design gives a more even balance of the load and facilitates simpler maneuvering between the stockroom shelves and small aisles.

After arriving at the specific shelves intended for the pallet, the hydraulics allow the forks to swing and slide the pallet into position. A reach truck will usually fit into an aisle less than 10 feet across without any issue as long as there are no hindrances protruding from the shelving.

Several types of the reach truck are offered. The most simple unit is the stand-up reach model which will slide forks beneath the pallet and move it to a stockroom location then slide it into place. This style of reach truck is idyllic for shelving units that are no deeper than an individual pallet of goods. A double-reach vehicle works in the same fundamental method as the stand-up type but uses telescopic forks that are long enough to slide a pallet into shelves that accommodate two pallets. Straddle reaches are a different reach truck variation. This style of reach truck slides underneath the pallet and is also able to grab the sides as well. The straddle reach unit is useful when grasping the sides of the pallet and cargo will not result in breakage. They permit easy pallet retrieval of a pallet that may be 4th or 5th in line and are effective when the shelving units are within reach in more than one direction.

Production plants, warehouses and even fabric businesses regularly utilize one or more types of reach truck. They can be used to store pallets of finished goods, storing provisions, materials, equipment, and to preserve the up keep of storage units is familiar practice. Reach trucks are very straightforward equipment to control to help make good use of your time and current stockroom space.
